2. The college offers a course in B.Sc. Nursing (4Yrs.) recognized by U.P State Medical Faculty (Letter No. 6805/15), Indian Nursing Council New Delhi (Letter No. 02/Jun/2015), and affiliated to Chhatrapati Sahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur.

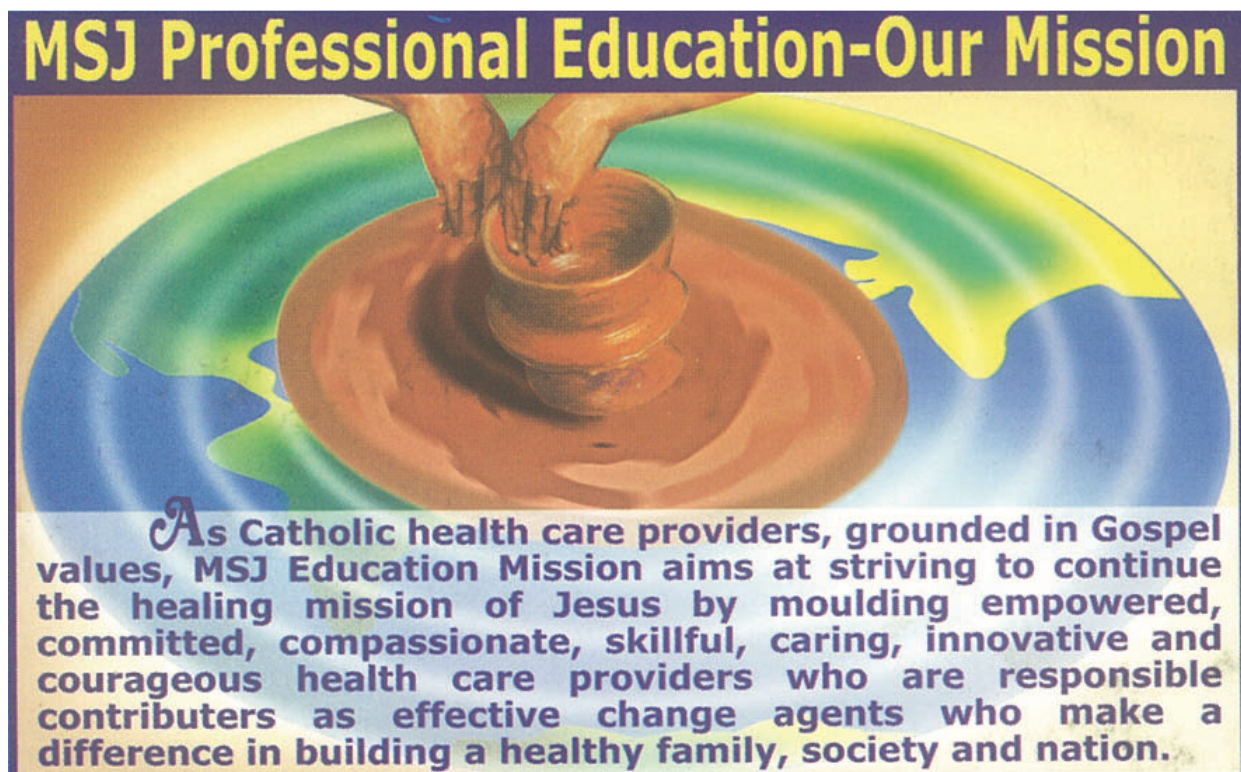

#### **VI. Duration of the course**

B.Sc. Nursing - 4Yrs. The medium of instruction is English.

#### **VII. Eligibility for admission to the B.Sc. Nursing (4Yrs.)**

1. Candidates should be between 17 and 35 years of age, by 31<sup>st</sup> December of the current year.
2. Candidates should be female and unmarried.
3. Physically and mentally fit to undergo the training.
4. The minimum educational requirements shall be the passing of: Senior School certificate Examination (10+2), Pre-degree Examination (10+2)

**Or**

An equivalent with 12 years schooling from a recognized board or university with Science (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) and English with minimum of **45%** aggregate marks (PCBE). **5%** relaxation for SC/ST candidates

**Note:-**

1. Anatomy and Physiology-Question paper will consist of section A Anatomy of 37 marks and B Physiology be of 38 marks.
2. Nutrition and Biochemistry and –Question paper will consist of section A Nutrition of 45 marks and Section B of Biochemistry of 30 marks.
3. Pharmacology, Genetics, Pathology: section A o Pharmacology with 38 marks, section B of Pathology of 25 and Genetics with 12 marks.
4. Nursing Research & Statistics-Nursing Research should be of 50 marks and Statistics of 25 marks.
5. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
6. Theory and practical exams for introduction to computer to be conducted as College exam and marks to be sent to the University for inclusion in the marks sheet.
7. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and practical papers separately.
8. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination.
9. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
10. A candidate has to pass in theory or practical exam separately in each of the paper.
11. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory ad Practical).
12. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examination before appearing for final year examination.
13. No institution shall submit average internal marks of the test students more than 75% is if 40 students are admitted in a course the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of total internal marks.
14. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
15. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day.
16. All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
17. One internal and one external examiners should jointly conducts practical examination for each student.
18. An examiner should be a lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc. (N) in concerned subject and minimum of 3years of teaching experience. To be an examiner for nursing foundations course faculty having M.Sc. (N) with any specialty shall be considered.

**X. Mode of application:-**

- \* Application forms duly filled in, together with photocopies of all necessary documents should reach the office of the Principal before..... When you fill the application form, please mention the phone number in your address- Landline, Mobile Number and email ID to contact you on phone/e-mail.

**XI. Application should be filled by the candidate's own hand writing.**

1. True copies of the mark sheets and sanad (Certificate) of High School/Metric and Intermediate or its equivalent examinations.
2. School Leaving certificate showing the date of Birth. (T.C)
3. Two certificates of character, one from the Principal of the college last attended by the candidate and other from the Parish priest in case of Christians (a distinguished person unrelated to the candidate, in case of Non Christians).
4. Merit certificate of extracurricular activities (if any).
5. Two self addressed and adequately stamped envelopes of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  x10 inches for registered post.
6. One copy of recent passport size photograph. (Other than the pasted one on the form)
7. Fitness certificate from a registered Medical officer.

**Incomplete applications will not be entertained**

1. Eligible candidates will appear for an entrance examination (Written Test) of one hour duration, containing questions from English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and General knowledge. There will be an interview after written test for those who have done the written exam satisfactorily. The date for the written test and interview will be intimated through a letter. Please enquire if you don't get the letter by.....
2. Selection and admission will be based on merits of qualifying examination, written test and personal interview.
3. Preference will be given to candidates from U.P state and of Christian minority groups.
4. The decision of the admission committee of the institution will be final and binding. **The selected candidate is required to deposit Rs. 10,000/- to the office within 5 days after the selected list has been put up on the notice board.** The balance payment of the 1<sup>st</sup> year should be paid on the day of admission. The money deposited will not be refunded if the candidate does not join or discontinues the course any time after admission.
5. Selected candidate will have to undergo a complete medical check-up at their own expenses conducted by the institution and only those found fit will be selected for the course.

6. Selected candidates are expected to bring two separate DDS at the time of admission, as the details given below:

## **XIII. Other Expenses:-**

1. Monthly mess fee is Rs. 1500/- (Changeable) The mess fee for the whole of first year i.e. Rs. 18,000/- is to be submitted at the time of admission.
2. Students also will have to pay for their textbooks at the time of admission. They will have to pay the fees for the University examinations, to the nursing council (yearly) and nurse's registration (after completion of the course). This amount is not included in the Fee structure and thus will be charged separately. Fees once paid will not be refunded.

**The course starts usually on the 1<sup>st</sup> working day of September.**

## **XIV. Rules & Regulations:-**

1. The students are directly under the control and direction of the Principal of the College of Nursing.
2. All the students have to reside in the 'Nurses Hostel' provided by the hospital (Hostel rules will be given upon admission to the hostel). Ragging is strictly prohibited.

3. Students are expected to comply with the rules and regulations of the college, the hostel and the hospital, subjects to change from time to time.
4. The student's performance is evaluated periodically, especially before promotion or appearance for University Examination. Students, whose conduct, attendance or performance in theory or clinical field is found not satisfactory, will not be allowed to attend the university examination. **The college authority reserves the right to promote or terminate a student, based on their performance.**
5. The students will appear for the examinations conducted by the CSJMU Kanpur, at the end of each year. **For the University Examinations, students must complete the requirements given by the University and College, must obtain a minimum of 50% marks in the Internal Examinations.** Candidates who fail in any of these will be detained from the university Examination to join the next junior group, then she has to repeat the year for which she will be charged in the college and hostel as per rules. **25% of the total marks for each subject under study is allotted to the internal assessment tests and assignments and 75% marks to the university examination. For practical examination 50% internal marks are allotted based on model practical assignments, attendance and 50% on University practical examination.**
6. No certificate will be issued until all dues to the institution have been paid.
7. All students **must wear the prescribed uniform of the college and hospital, while they are on duty and in the class room.**
8. Students should be courteous and considerate to the patients, visitors, the public, authorities, and all the health team members. They should impart compassionate love through their words and deeds and provide quality service. Students shall maintain a high standard of conduct.
9. Students abstaining from duty or from hostel without prior permission from the principal or her deputies will be guilty of misconduct.
10. **Visiting the students:-** Students will be allowed to meet visitors on the First Sunday of each month in the 1<sup>st</sup> year, Second Sunday of the month in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, Third Sunday of the month in 3<sup>rd</sup> year, Fourth Sunday in Fourth year. Only those visitors approved by the parents will be allowed to meet them. When you want an exception from this, please discuss with principal before you come. **Taking visitors to the rooms or any other section of the hostel is considered a serious offence, and will be dealt with accordingly.**
11. Visiting hours is from **01:00PM to 05:00PM on off days.** Visitors during working day and duty hours are strictly forbidden.
12. Phone calls: Phone calls to students are entertained only between 02:30PM to 07:30 PM on Sundays. Specific days are kept for each year students, for the convenience to get phone call to all. (Birthdays are exempted). No phone calls will be entertained during the preparatory and examination days. **Ph. No. 0522-6525302, 7754938659, 7703001495.**



13. **Students are not allowed to keep mobile phones either in college or hospital.** If you want to contact the Principal. E-mail ID of the College- fatimacon2015@gmail.com

14. Students are allowed to have 8 weeks holidays plus 10 days sick leave per year.

The annual leave is arranged by the college at such time as convenient in keeping with the requirements of the course. **The leave period cannot be altered for individual students. Any student having more than 10days shortage of attendance must make up in the current year itself before University examination commences.** Others who have to take long sick leave will have to either join supplementary batch or join the next session. No special leave will be granted for functions, weddings, retreats etc.

15. Religious sisters are expected to make their retreat during their annual leave. No other special leave will be granted for this purpose. Permission to visit relatives should be obtained from the concerned superior. Sisters will not be allowed to go for their vows renewal and triennial vows during the course of study. Academic year plan will be displayed in advance on notice board.

16. Students should have medical examination every year, if a student is found medically unfit, she will be required to leave. All medical expenses must be met by the student. Any student suffering from a serious illness requiring long rest is sent home for recuperation. In case of need, the student period may be extended to another academic year.

17. Students will be dismissed, at any time, for misconduct, disobedience, inefficiency or repeated serious negligence of duty.

18. Students are forbidden to accept gift or hospitality of any kind from patients or their attendants.

19. Students may not collect any money for treat, get together and even for charitable purpose without sanction of the principal.

20. Students will be asked to replace or compensate for loss or damage caused to equipments.

21. Students shall not bring any jewellery, except a pair of small ear studs for use. The institution takes no responsibility for the theft or loss of any personal articles or money of the students. Students will be given a small cupboard which she can lock and keep the key with her.

22. Marriage is not allowed during the student period.

23. A copy of curriculum, rules and regulations for the course can be obtained from the office after admission on payment of Rs. 200/-
